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




STEP ONE

STEP TWO

GET GOOD WITH YOUR GEAR

It's important you are confident with how your gear works. Take the rod out of your case along with your tackle box, and let's get started.

First: (Put The Rod Together)



Place the bottom and top sections together and align the eyelets.



Thread the line through each eyelet until it comes out the top of the rod.



Place the line under the bale of the reel to engage the reel.



Pull out extra line, so it goes down and meets up with the reel.

Second: (Tie On The Hook (Improved Clinch Knot)




Pull line through the eye and double back making five turns around the standing line.




Holding coils, pull the end through the first loop and then through the big loop. Slide tight, and clip ends.




Third: (Put On The Bobber)



Press the red button on the top of the bobber, slide line through the hook on the bottom of the bobber.




Place the bobber three feet up the line from the hook.



Place thumb under the bottom hook on the bobber and press down top button.



Make a half loop and slide the loop under the hook of the bobber and then release.



To adjust your line length as needed.

Fourth: (Put On The Split Shot (Weight)



Slide the mouth of the split shot onto the line one foot above the hook.




Using your needle nose pliers crimp the split shot securely to the line.

For more weight add another split shot.



Fifth: (Put On The Bait)



Powerbait

Scoop out a dime size glob of power bait roll it into a ball and pinch it onto the hook around the middle of the hook.



Salmon Eggs

Pick out a salmon egg and place the hook through the middle of the egg.

Add enough eggs to cover the lower half of the hook.



Nightcrawler

Pick out one healthy nightcrawler and place the hook once through the front of the worm and once through the ring are of the worm.

The nightcrawler should have a longer dangling tail that wiggles and attract fish.

Sixth: (Your complete setup)



Starting at the bottom is your hook, the line in-between the hook and swivel is your leader. One foot up from your bait is your two split shots.

Two or three feet from the swivel is your bobber.
